If you missed our Stakeholders' Meeting at the beginning of the month, you missed an excellent presentation on the state's "Move on When Ready" program. This program allows high school students to be dually enrolled at their home high school and a college or technical school. Students can complete their high school graduation requirements, while also earning college credit. The program is at no cost to parents or students. If your child is interested or qualified to take part in this program, I highly recommend it. Students who take part in the "Move on When Ready" program do not have to pay for tuition, fees or books. By earning college credit before high school graduation, students are able to graduate from college with less student debt. Please visit our website to learn more about "Move on When Ready."

Beginning next fall, Paulding County will have a new blended learning program. The Paulding Virtual Academy will allow high school students to complete their coursework at their pace, online. The program will be housed at New Hope Education Center and offer flexibility for those students who wish to study outside of a traditional high school classroom setting. An informational meeting will be held on March 3 at 6:30pm in the auditorium at Paulding County High School.

At its January 12th meeting, the board held its annual elections.

Mr. Kim Curl was elected to serve as board chairman for 2016. This is Mr. Curl's 22nd year serving on the Paulding County Board of Education. He owns C&C Pharmacy in Dallas.

Mr. Sammy McClure was elected to serve as vice chair. Mr. McClure has served the Paulding County School District in many roles, including a teacher, assistant principal, principal and the district curriculum coordinator prior to his retirement. He previously served as board chairman from 2006-2008. HE was the first African-American to hold that position.



At its January 26th meeting, the board received its monthly financial update for the period that ended November 30th. As of November 30th, revenues were at \$109.5 million and expenditures were at \$94.8 million.

Summer School 15-16 @NHEC

Paulding County School District's 2015– 2016 summer school provides an opportunity for all currently enrolled Paulding County School District students in grades 9 – 12 to recover credits attempted throughout the school year. Opportunities for new credit are available on a limited basis. All courses are offered in an online format via A+ software with our teachers/facilitators.

Please note that K12 courses are not accepted by the NCAA for athletic eligibility. If your student is an athlete, you should consult with your home school counselor to support your registration process.

Registration: Registration must be approved and completed by the districted school counselor. Transportation is not provided. \$275.00 per ½ credit; \$550 per full credit in the form of cash, money order, cashier check, or personal checks. Payment must be provided for in full at the time of registration. Refunds are provided prior to June 6, 2016.

INTERNATIONAL SKILLS DIPLOMA SEAL

In today's global marketplace, it is important for students to acquire the interdisciplinary skills they need to be globally competent and competitive. To recognize students who have completed an international education curriculum and engaged in extracurricular activities and experiences that foster the achievement of global competencies, the high schools in Paulding County have been approved to award an International Skills Diploma Seal to eligible graduating high school students. An application for students will be available March 1st on the website for students who have met the following criteria:

- At least three credits in the same world language and/or ESOL,
- At least four credits in courses determined to have an international focus, such as economics, world/non-US history, world geography, etc.,
- At least four extracurricular activities and experiences with global themes and/or global contexts,
- 20 hours of community service involving a global service project, and
- Capstone presentation on the knowledge gained in the courses and activities listed above
