## 6-12 ELA Digital Learning Day Guidance

## **General Information:**

As you develop digital lessons for students please review the following guidance:

- Consider the essential/priority standards for English/Language Arts and our district pacing guides.
- Consider including a variety of assignment types.
- Create lessons that incorporate reading and writing as a reciprocal process.
- Include both informational and literary text opportunities.
- As you prepare writing lessons, keep in mind the various formats of writing including narrative response, constructed response, and extended constructed response.
- Please keep in mind that no summative activities/grades should be assigned.
- In addition, please follow the district guidance for length of assignments. Each lesson should be 20-30 min in length for grades 6-8 and 30-45 min in length for grades 9-12.

Teachers should also be mindful of the Milestone weights for standards and content topics. This information can be helpful when determining priority standards and pacing. ## **Resources For Digital Learning:**

- **USATestprep** is a resource that provides instructional videos and practice. Students and teachers will log in through Canvas. The teacher accounts were merged recently, so if anyone has trouble logging in, please contact <a href="mailto:support@usatestprep.com">support@usatestprep.com</a>. There are video lessons, games, activities and assessments based on the standards.
- MyOn (Grades 6-8) is a resource for texts during digital learning. Teachers and students can access MyOn through Clever located on the middle school dashboard. In MyOn, teachers can assign texts and create projects. This <a href="link">link</a> explains how to create projects within MyOn.
- Learnzillion has reading and writing lesson plans available for each grade level. Teachers can access LearnZillion resources and texts by going to the middle/high school dashboard and choosing the LearnZillion icon. Once in LearnZillion, teachers should click on "English Language Arts" and then choose "Close Reading" to access these lessons/texts.
- **Readworks.org** is a site that allows teachers to search for texts by lexile level and/or content. Each text is also attached to a skill such as predicting, comprehension, sequencing, comparing, inferencing, etc.
- **Britannica School** can be found on the student dashboard for both middle and high school students. Here students have access to many nonfiction texts.
- **Discovery Education** can be found on the middle-high school dashboard under popular resources. On this site teachers can access a variety of videos, activities, and resources by selecting English/Language Arts. Teachers can select by grade level to access resources for grammar, composition, and reading/literature.
- Online pdf versions of many short stories from the anthologies as well as many novels are available.
