#### **Course Descriptions**

This course will provide an exploratory foundation in computer programming. Through integrated instructional activities, students will have opportunities to apply employability skills and to explore STEM careers in the information technology area. They will also complete many online activities to build a foundation in programming. Students will work with Georgia Tech's EarSketch program, Thunkable Mobile App Creator, and Code.org. Capstone projects will be incorporated at the completion of all standards as time allows. Students who successfully complete this course will be prepared for the following pathways upon entering high school: Web & Digital Design, Web Development, and Game Design.
