What Is a Title I School?

√Title I was enacted in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Act amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). It is the largest Federal Assistance Program for our nation's schools.

√The purpose of Title I is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and to achieve proficiency on high academic standards.

√Title I provides federal funds through the Georgia Department of Education to schools with at least 40% of the student population receiving free and reduced meals.

Title I funds at our school are applied to:

- ✓ Supplementing programs that are already in place in schools, with the goal of providing all students with equal opportunity for achieving academic success
- ✓ Hiring additional teachers and other support staff
- ✓ Purchasing supplemental (additional) instructional materials, resources, and educational programs
- ✓ Conducting parent activities and workshops focusing on how the school and families can work together to support students in content academic areas and other opportunities parents request
- ✓ Providing professional development for teachers and staff
- ✓ Establishing a parent resource center
- ✓ Outreach to local Pre-K schools

ELA SMART Goal #1: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year (SY25), we will increase the percentage of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students scoring proficient and above in English Language Arts (ELA) on the Georgia Milestones Assessment by 10% from 29.0% (SY24) to 39.0% (SY25).

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year (SY25), we will increase the percentage of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students with disabilities (SWD) scoring proficient and above in English Language Arts (ELA) on the Georgia Milestones Assessment by 10% from 1.8% (SY24) to 11.8% (SY25).

Math SMART Goal #2: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year (SY25), we will increase the percentage of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students scoring proficient and above in Mathematics on the Georgia Milestones Assessment by 10% from 31.3% (SY24) to 41.3% (SY25).

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year (SY25), we will increase the percentage of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students with disabilities (SWD) scoring proficient and above in Mathematics on the Georgia Milestones Assessment by 10% from TBD% (SY24) to TBD% (SY25) The programs and supports in place to help us achieve these goals:
