Accountability Goal #2: The percentage of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students scoring proficient and above on the Spring Math Georgia Milestones Assessment will increase from 47% in Spring 2025 to 50% in Spring 2026.

Demographics

Our school community is growing and continues to reflect a rich and diverse population. We currently serve 1,342 students across all grades. Enrollment is fairly balanced between boys (651) and girls (691). The largest class size is in Grade 2, with 234 students, while Pre-K remains our smallest group with 38 students. Our student body is made up of a variety of racial and ethnic backgrounds. Black students make up about 38% of our population. White students account for nearly 37%, Hispanic students make up around 15%. Smaller groups include Asian, Native American, Pacific Islander, and multi-racial students. We're proud of the diversity within our school and remain committed to creating an inclusive, supportive environment for every child.
