# Teachers, Parents, Students – Together for Success

### In the Second Grade Classroom

Teachers will work with students and their families in partnership for student success in reading and math. We will work with families to support students in the following ways:

- Provide students with a variety of reading resources, differentiated by student reading level to read at home and school.
- Provide daily math review skill practice as needed.
- Communicate with parents about their child's reading progress weekly.
- Provide differentiated strategies for students to help students reach their goals.

#### Home

School parents joined staff to develop plans on how families can support student success in reading and math.

- Parents will monitor student reading at their reading level each night.
- Practice daily math review of skills with students nightly.
- Parents will know and understand their student's reading level and will use teacher guidance to support their child's progress.
- Parents will monitor student progress by viewing student assessments in student folders/binders weekly and provide support to their student as needed with teacher guidance.

### Hal Hutchens Elementary Second Grade Students

Hal Hutchens Elementary students joined staff and parents in developing plans to be the best we can be in Reading and Math!

- Practice reading fluency nightly by reading to or with an adult daily.
- Practice math skills nightly.
- Students will know their reading levels and use strategies to improve their reading ability.
- Students will share assessments with family and understand their scores and next steps.



# Our Goals for Student Achievement

## **Paulding County School District Goals 2021-2022**

- During the 2021-2022, PCSD will prepare students to increase the percent of students scoring proficient/advanced in Math, Science, ELA and Social Studies by 3% on Georgia Milestones.
- During 2021-2022, PCSD will prepare students to increase the performance of subgroups (SWD, EL, ED) in ELA by 3% on Georgia Milestones.
- During 2021-2022, PCSD will reduce the percentage of subgroups (SWD, EL, ED) assigned to OSS and ISS by 3% as reported in the student information system within subgroups.

## Hal Hutchens Elementary Goals 2021-2022

- Goal #1- First Grade students scoring proficient in their level of iRead will increase by 10% or more from August 2021 to May 2022. Second Grade students achieving a Lexile on the August 2021 administration of the Reading Inventory will increase by 10% or more by the May 2022 administration. Third through Fifth Grade students scoring at their grade Lexile Level midpoint on the August 2021 administration of the Reading Inventory will increase by 10% or more by the May 2022 administration.
- **Goal #2-** Students in Third through Fifth Grade scoring proficient or advanced on the May 2021 administration of the Math Inventory will increase by 10% or more on the May 2022 administration of the Math Inventory.
- **Goal #3-** Students in third through fifth grade scoring proficient or advanced on the Fall 2021 administration of the Narrative Pre-Writing Assessment will increase by 10% on the Spring Narrative Post Writing Assessment.

Compacts are discussed with parents/guardians and students during Parent/Teacher Conference Week (10/11/21-10/15/21). Feedback and requests for support are welcome at any time. The parent/guardian of each student at Hal Hutchens Elementary receives a Compact during the Parent-Teacher Conference week, and teachers share details of the student role as stated in the Compact with all students.
