Building Partnerships

- ✓ <u>Reading</u>: I will spend time nightly reading material that is at my Lexile level. I will read to or with my parent/guardian every day to meet my fluency goals.
- ✓ <u>Math:</u> I will explain math strategies to my parent when completing math activities. I will review my math journal to practice what I am doing in class and practice my math facts nightly with my family. I will also use my Mental Math strategies from Number Talks.
- ✓ Parent Resource Center: I will take home and use reading and math items from the Parent Resource Center to use with my parent/guardian.
- ✓ Parent Engagement: I will encourage my parent/guardian/family to attend at least two parent events this school year.

- Reading: I will encourage my child to read, using the provided Lexile level books and software as available. These will include books that are within the recommended Lexile range (100L below to 200L above his/her Lexile measure).

- Students in grades 3-5 will meet RI growth goals, increasing from 74% in 2019 to 77% in 2020.
- Students in grades 1-5 scoring proficient and advanced will grow 3% on the MI from 18% in August 2019 to 21% in May 2020.
- Students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient and distinguished will grow from 36% in 2019 to 39% in 2020 as measured by the ELA achievement scores on Georgia Milestones.
- We will focus on leveled reading practice, goal setting in reading, math strategies, and goal setting in math.
