Building Partnerships

Ragsdale Elementary is committed to providing families with resources and opportunities for learning to work in partnership with the school in supporting students.

- Our Parent Resource Center (PRC) offers educational games, books, and other materials available for parents to borrow for free. A computer with internet access for parent use may be accessed. The PRC is open every school day, from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 pm and is located in Room B103 next to the media center.
- Two Family Academic Nights are offered for parents and families in the first half of the school year to provide an overview of the grade level learning expectations and to assist families with goal setting in Reading, Writing and Math. Teachers will help provide strategies that families can use at home to assist their child. Additional community partners will offer free academic materials to use at home during these nights.
- A variety of Parent Engagement opportunities and Family
 Academic Nights are offered throughout the year, providing
 information on topics such as Math and Reading Strategies,
 Science and Social Studies, Understanding Georgia Assessments,
 and more. All parents are invited to request specific topics of
 interest.
- A Title I **Newsletter** is sent home quarterly, with news on upcoming Parent Engagement events, academic information, and community resource links.

Communicating Your Child's Progress

Ragsdale Elementary realizes the importance of frequent and specific communication with parents.

- Parent-Teacher Conferences will take place October 10th − 14th, 2022 and March 13th − 17th, 2023.
- Student Reports are issued every nine weeks, in addition to progress reports.
- Classroom Newsletters are updated and posted on a weekly basis. It is a great way to stay connected to what is happening in the class.
