What is it?

How is it revised?

The survey will also ask for suggestions and input in the development of an updated Parent & Family Engagement Plan. Participation from parents will also be sought through responses on feedback forms provided at all parent involvement meetings and activities, the availability of a suggestion box, meetings planned specifically for developing the plan together, and an online survey linked directly in connection with this plan.

Who is it for?

Ragsdale Elementary is a school wide Title I school, and all students and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. We always strive to make continual progress in working with our parents and welcome any feedback and suggestions throughout the school year.
