
What Is a Title I School?

✓ Title I was enacted in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act and amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). It is the largest Federal Assistance Program for our nation's schools.

✓ The purpose of Title I is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and to achieve proficiency on high academic standards.

✓ Title I provides federal funds through the Georgia Department of Education to Title I schools based on the student population receiving free and reduced meals. Funds are used to help impact student achievement.

Title I funds are applied to:



- Hiring additional teachers and other support staff
- Purchasing supplemental (additional) instructional materials, resources, and educational programs
- Conducting parent activities and workshops focusing on how the school and families can work together to support students in content academic areas and other opportunities parents request
- Providing professional development for teachers and staff
- ✓ Establishing a parent resource center
- ✓ Outreach to local Pre-K schools



How McGarity Elementary Participates in the Title I Program

- Provides additional support during instruction
 - Literacy Bookworms Shared Reading, Differentiated Instruction (DI), Writing Instruction
 - Math Math Workshop, Do The Math (DTM)
- Provides supplemental materials for instruction

McGarity's Schoolwide Program

Our School Improvement Plan (schoolwide goals) includes the following:

- Goal 1: Increase percentage of 4th-5th grade ELA Georgia Milestone Assessment level 3 and 4 by 5% in each grade level (4th grade 37% to 42%, 5th grade 32% to 37%) by the end of the 2022-23 school year.
- Goal 2: Increase percentage of 4th-5th grade Math Georgia Milestone Assessment level 3 and 4 by 5% in each grade level (4th grade 55% to 60%, 5th grade 39% to 44%) by the end of the 2022-23 school year.
- Goal 3: Increase percentage of 5th grade students Science Georgia Milestone Assessment level 3 and 4 by 5% (38% to 43%) by the end of the 2022-23 school year.


