Located about 30 miles northwest of Atlanta and ranked as the second fastest-growing county in Metro Atlanta, Hiram's students have the unique opportunity to see and experience the diversity and culture of a large city, while still maintaining an unhurried pace of life in the suburbs.

Demographics

Hiram High School serves approximately 1,456 students in grades 9-12. The student population is diverse, with the following racial and ethnic composition: 18.1% Hispanic/Latino, 53.85% Black/African, 21.1% White, 0.7% Asian, 0.1% Native American, and 6.1% identifying as two or more races. Approximately 35% of students are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch, 5% of the student body is classified as English Language Learners (ELL), and 20% of the student body receive Special Education services.
