A Family-School Compact is an action plan to enhance schools and promote student success.

The Family-School Compact:

- Describes how Dobbins Middle School and families can work together to help students achieve the State's achievement standards.
- Is developed jointly with families, students, and teachers.
- Links together district, school, and classroom goals for student achievement.
- Lists strategies for teachers, families, and students to work together towards meeting the goals.
- Describes opportunities for families to stay engaged with the school and in student progress.
- Provides and explains methods of two-way communication between the school and home and opportunities for families to be engaged at the school.
