Herschel Jones Middle School is the oldest of ten middle schools in Paulding County. We are located in the heart of Paulding County – downtown Dallas. As one of the oldest facilities in the district, THE HJMS is a cornerstone of Paulding County's educational history. While the site was originally opened as Dallas High School in 1901, it was repurposed as Dallas Jr. High School when Paulding County High School opened in 1969. The name was later changed to Herschel Jones Junior High School and eventually Herschel Jones Middle School to honor the life and legacy of William Herschel Jones who served as a teacher and principal in Paulding Count School District for forty years.

Demographics

HJMS serves a diverse population of approximately 710 students, about evenly split between 6th, 7th and 8th grade. Our student body makeup includes 49% Black/African American, 27.1% white, 15.3% Latino/Hispanic, 1.4% Asian, and less than 1% each of American Indian/Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander.

Approximately 70% of our students are eligible for free or reduced lunch, indicating a significant number of low-income families. Additionally, 7% of our students are classified as English Learners and 18.4% are students with disabilities who receive special education services.
