#### Reading

We will continue reading <u>Charlie and</u> the <u>Chocolate Factory</u> as a read aloud in class. As we read the text, we will be working on story elements (setting, characters, and events). To help with comprehension, we will begin discussing what good readers do:

Make connections with the text. There are four different types of connections that we will discuss.

- Two connections between characters/individuals.
- 2. Two connections between events.
- Two connections between ideas.
- 4. Two connections between pieces of information.

**R2:** Identifies key details; retells stories

R3: describes story elements using key details

**RI3:** Describes connections between two individuals, events, ideas, or pieces of information.

Again, we will be working on adding and subtracting word problems through 20. It is important that your child demonstrate her knowledge by showing their work. This can be done in a variety of ways: ten frame, tally marks, pictures, dots, or using a number line. We will also be assessing math fact fluency.

For Math NBI, we will be working on base ten. This will require that your child know that in the number 53 there are five tens and three ones. Your child will also be comparing numbers and determining which number is greater than or less than the other. We will also be representing data and interpreting data.

OA1: Uses addition and subtraction within 20 to solve word problems by using objects, drawing, and equations.

**OA5:** Relate counting to addition and subtraction

**OA6:** Demonstrates timed fluency within

NBT1: Extends the counting sequence. MD4: Represents and interprets data.

#### School - to -Home Connection

Math: Can your child make ten pairs? These are two numbers, that when added together, make 10. You can practice this by saying the number 2 and see if your child can come up with the 8. Practice with all ten pairs. If your child is able, she can call out both addends.

Reading: We are going to be working with reading fluency (how many correct words read in a minute). You can use a page in a book, newspaper, back of a cereal box...time your child for one minute. Go over words that he missed and then reread the same text the next day.

Phonics: Last week, we discussed how to label words (and break them apart) based on the vccv pattern. Give your child the following words to see if she can divide them correctly. This helps with sounding out unknown words.

picnic napkin happy

monster window sucke

### <u>Language Arts</u>

In phonics this week, we will be working with Sneaky e—a consonant e; o consonant e; u consonant e; I consonant e; e consonant e and spelling with Final ke.

We have been working with "How To" writing and will be finishing those pieces and moving into our informational writing pieces.

**SPELLING:** We will have mystery words that follow the same patterns as the following words: best,

p<u>ick</u>, bl<u>ack, am</u>, and tr<u>im</u>.

### S.S./Science

We will continue our study of light. Whether the light is artificial or natural. We will also begin to study shadows.

Our historical figure will be Thomas Jefferson. We will later use this information when we study Lewis and Clark and Sacagawea.
