Paulding County School District Goals for 2024-2025

1. By May 2024, enhance the quality and effectiveness of professional learning initiatives to empower teachers in positively transforming their instructional practices, thereby directly impacting student achievement.

2. By May 2024, cultivate meaningful collaborative opportunities that foster strong relationships and active engagement between District staff, families, and communities, resulting in a positive impact on student achievement.

3. Increase student performance in all core content areas by 3% annually as measured by achievement data.

#### Allgood Elementary Goals for 2024-2025

1. We will increase teacher knowledge of collaboration through the PLC process as measured by an increase in student achievement from 29.9% proficiency in ELA to 33% and increase proficiency in Math by 3% by having teachers participate in professional development for weekly PLCs from August 2024-May 2025. Building collective teacher efficacy leads to increased student achievement.

2. By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, we aim to maintain the percentage of students without behavior referrals at or above 90% with a baseline of 92% by continuing a Social Emotional Learning (SEL) program and PBIS. This initiative is intended to enhance teacher and student engagement in the learning process, facilitating a positive educational environment.

### Allgood Elementary Parent & Family Engagement Plan

<u>What is it?</u> Allgood Elementary's Parent and Family Engagement Plan is a plan that outlines what we will provide for parents and guardians, and how we will provide opportunities to work together, to strengthen the academic success of each child in our school. This plan is developed with input from parents and school staff.

**How is the plan revised?** Our Parent and Family Engagement Plan is updated every year. In early spring, a survey is made available to all parents, and may be taken on-line or on a paper copy that is sent home to all parents of our students. It is advertised through bulletins, phone calls, and in parent meetings. The survey asks for feedback on components of the current plan and parent engagement opportunities that took place during the school year and invites suggestions and input in the development of the updated Parent and Family Engagement Plan. Parents are involved in decisions regarding how reserved funds are allocated for parent engagement activities through responses on feedback forms provided at all parent engagement meetings and activities, the availability of a suggestion box, and spring meetings planned specifically for developing the plan together.

Once the plan is created, it is presented to parents and school staff (in parent engagement meetings, through the school website, and accessibility to paper copies in the school) for final agreement. It is then introduced as the Parent and Family Engagement Plan for the current school year at the Annual Title I Parent Meeting which takes place in early fall.

*Where is it available?* Allgood Elementary's Parent and Family Engagement Plan is distributed to all parents/guardians of students in our school and is available to the community on our school website and in our Parent Resource Center. It is written in a language that parents can understand, and translation is available, as practical, upon request. We strive to make continual progress in collaborating with our parents and always welcome any feedback and suggestions throughout the school year.

PCSD will collaborate with local and State institutions for neglected or delinquent children and youth in order for these students to have the opportunity to meet the same challenging State academic standards as all children in the State. If such students are being educated at a PCSD Title I school, the residential facilities that reside in the school's attendance area will be included in the correspondence and activities outlined in the school's parental involvement plan. A representative from the facilities will serve as a proxy for the parents.

### Allgood Elementary is a Title I School

Title I is a federally funded program for schools. The funds are used for educational services for children to provide additional support to ensure academic success. The focus of the Title I program is on helping *all* students meet high standards.

At Allgood Elementary, our Title I program provides the following:

- Teachers who work with students who can benefit from additional support
- Learning resources for students
- Professional learning resources for teachers
- Resources and activities for parents to access as they support their child academically

## **Family-School Compacts**

Allgood Elementary's Parent and Family Engagement Plan includes a Compact, which is developed jointly by staff, parents/guardians, and students. The Compact is an agreement that explains how parents/guardians, teachers, and students will work together to make sure that every student is supported in reaching academic success. All parents of students at Allgood Elementary School are invited to review the Compact and provide feedback and input every year. Revisions are made, based on input from parents, students, and teachers. They are shared in October at Parent-Teacher Conference time and serve as a reminder of our commitment to action in supporting every student at Allgood. All parents have access to a copy of the compact. The compact will be utilized throughout the year through student goal setting and progress monitoring, staff professional learning, and in parent meetings.

#### **Parent Meeting/Events:**



Allgood Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong parental engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. Meetings and activities will be provided at a variety of times and formats to help accommodate parent/guardian schedules. Other meetings may be available, as requested by parents.

#### Open House- July 30, 2024: Parents meet their child's teacher and the Allgood staff.

**Curriculum Night – September 5, 2024:** Share expectations for the year, view the curriculum, including the Georgia Standards of Excellence, discuss the administration of state and local assessments, including the Georgia Milestones, Acadience, and Growth Measures.

<u>Annual Title I Parent Meeting- October 2024</u>: Review what it means to be a Title I school, Title I documents (Parent Right to Know, school requirements, Parent Engagement Plan, Family-School Compacts), Title I Parent Engagement Budget, District Parent Engagement Plan, Schoolwide School Improvement Plan, Parent Resource Center, and parent feedback opportunities, and more.

**Parent-Teacher Conferences- October 07-08, 2024 & March 10-11, 2025:** We invite parents to participate in conferences to discuss your child's academic progress. Teachers will share classroom data with you, along with our Family-School Compact.

**Prepping Your Child for State & Local Assessments – Spring 2025:** We invite you to attend this meeting to receive valuable information on your child's recent reading and math data, receive helpful strategies to support continued learning, and gain insight and resources on standardized testing (Georgia Milestones).

**Spring Planning & Input Meetings: March/April 2025:** Parents will be invited to jointly develop our School Improvement Plan, Compact, Parent Engagement Budget, Staff Capacity Activities, and Parent & Family Engagement Plan.

**<u>Kindergarten Sneak-a-Peek- May 2025</u>**: Parents of incoming kindergarten students will have the opportunity to meet Allgood staff and receive information about kindergarten expectations. They will tour the school and receive information on how to help their child prepare for kindergarten.

**Harvard Family Dinner Project**- TBD: This research-based project is designed to increase students' vocabulary development, increase grades, and improve achievement scores.

All parents/guardians of students attending Allgood Elementary are invited to participate in all planned events and activities. Language translation of all materials and documents shared with parents/guardians is available upon request.

### Definition of Parental Engagement
