

Chunking

What is chunking?

Most of us are familiar with spelling lists, but research shows this is not best practice for students learning to spell.

What has been Shown to be effective is "chunking" or breaking words into Smaller segments.

According to the authors of our curriculum, Bookworms Literacy, "chunking words into syllables is an aid in decoding, spelling, and meaning. Multisyllabic word study words can be analyzed at the syllable level. The goal of this instruction is to build flexible strategies for attacking unknown words."

Decoding and Encoding

Breaking words into syllables helps us hear word parts which makes it easier to spell words. Here are the steps we take when we break words into their syllable types.

Six Syllable Types



Vowels are CLOSED in by at least one consonant, so they re short- they can't say their name.








