FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I have to have a job?

Yes, you should have a job by the first week of school. It can be paid or unpaid.

Can you help me find a job?

We will be glad to help direct you to job opportunities and employers we work with in the community. It is ultimately your responsibility to obtain the job.

What is a Career Pathway?

We would like your job to match your pathway, but it is not required.

Career Pathways: Agriculture, Automotive, Marketing, Healthcare, Business, Personal Care Services, Information Technology, Culinary Arts, Music, Visual Arts, Architecture Drawing and Design, Audio Visual, Law Enforcement, Construction

Do I need a car?

You should have reliable transportation, a driver's license, and a parking spot.

How many blocks of Work-Based Learning can I do?

Up to 2 blocks.

Do I have to work every day?

No, but you must work at least 7.5 hours/week for each block class of WBL. You must leave campus daily during your WBL block.

Ex. 1 Block = 7.5 hours/week 2 Blocks = 15 hours/week

Can I work for my parent, as a babysitter or my own job?

No. You cannot work for a parent directly, but you can work at their job under a different supervisor/mentor. You cannot work in a personal home environment. You cannot be your own mentor/supervisor. All businesses must be registered with the state and have a business license.
