## Humility

### BIG IDEA

Humility does not mean thinking less of yourself. It means thinking about yourself less. It means putting someone else's needs and desires before your own. Someone who has humility thinks about serving others rather than their own pursuits. People who have humility have a stronger sense of identity, character, and belonging.

### ACT IT OUT

Training your children to have humility is the same as training them not to be entitled. Model for your children what it looks like to think about and serve others. When you go to the kitchen, ask if anyone else would like anything. Take your kids to a food bank to serve. Do activities like that regularly. When they perform an act of selflessness, praise and reward them. Also, teach them to clean up for themselves.
