

What Is a Family-School Compact?

A Family-School Compact is an action plan to enhance schools and promote student success.

The Family-School Compact describes how Hutchens Elementary and families can work together to help children achieve the State's high standards. It outlines how parents, the school staff, and students will share responsibility for improved student academic achievement.

Hutchens Elementary is committed to providing families with resources and opportunities for learning in order to assist parents in working with their child.

- ✿ Our **Parent Resource Center** (PRC) offers educational games, books, and other materials available for parents to borrow for free. **Computers** with internet access for parent use may be accessed. The PRC is open every school day, from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00p.m.
- ✿ **Grade Level Orientation Nights** take place in August. Classroom teachers provide parents with an overview of the grade level's expectations and standards.

Communicating Your Child's Progress

Hutchens Elementary realizes the importance of frequent and specific communication with parents.

- ✿ **Student progress/goal sheets** will be sent home weekly by classroom teachers in student binder or "Take Home" Tuesday Folders.
- ✿ **Parent-Teacher Conferences** will take place 10/10/16-10/14/16 and 03/20/17-03/24/17.
- ✿ **Student Reports** are issued every nine weeks (10/14/16, 1/10/17, 3/24/17, and 6/2/17), in addition to progress reports issued every 4 weeks.
- ✿ **Opportunities to participate or observe in the classrooms** will be offered throughout the year. Parents are always welcome!
- ✿ **Weekly newsletters, Class Dojo and/or student agendas** are used to communicate classroom assignments and activities.

In the Kindergarten Classroom

Teachers will work with students and their families in partnership for student success in reading and math. We will work with families to support students in the following ways:

- Provide number and quantity cards for student practice
- Introduce math strategies that can be used at home during Number Talks and Math workshop to develop number sense
- Provide differentiated reading activities and strategies
- Provide sight word folder weekly with suggested activities



Home

School parents joined staff to develop plans on how families can support student success in reading and math.

- Practice number recognition and proper number formation with my child.
- Support my child's counting practice using suggested strategies from teacher. (Ex - having them count objects around the house and practice rote counting (1-100) while riding in the car, etc.)
- Parents will know and understand their student's foundational reading skill level and will use teacher guidance to support their child's progress.
- Parents will monitor student progress by viewing student sight word folders weekly and practice nightly to provide reading support.

- Use number cards nightly to practice number concepts and identification.
- Use strategies to count and sort objects at home
