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Three PCSD Schools Named Math Leaders for Achievement and Growth in Mathematics

Three Paulding County schools – East Paulding Middle School, Sammy McClure Middle School, and Paulding County High School – have been named Math Leader schools by the Georgia Department of Education. According to the Georgia DOE, "Schools were recognized for achievement or growth in the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient Learner level or above in mathematics."

This new award was created to recognize schools for performance in meeting the new Georgia K-12 Mathematics Standards implemented during the 2023-2024 school year. East Paulding Middle School and Paulding County High School were recognized for growth in mathematics, while McClure Middle School was recognized for both achievement and growth.

The criteria for the 2023-2024 Math Leader Awards recognize the crucial importance of numeracy skills in fifth and eighth grades and require higher growth from schools with lower achievement levels. Awards were given at the elementary and middle-school levels, and at the high-school level based on the Algebra: Concepts and Connections EOC, which is the state test for mathematics in high school.

"The recognition of these three Paulding schools as Georgia DOE Math Leaders is a testament to our commitment to mathematics education," said Chief Academic Officer Tiffany Frachiseur. "By strategically targeting funding to provide instructional support and align resources, we are fostering a coherent K-12 math experience driving achievement across the board.
