

Summer School 2025

Paulding County School District's 2025 summer school provides an opportunity for all currently enrolled Paulding County School District students in grades 8 to 12 to recover high school level credits attempted throughout the school year.

Opportunities for new credit are available with prior approval. All courses are offered in an online format via Edmentum software with our teachers/facilitators.

All grades for summer school will be available to the districted school once the summer school session has ended.

Registration:

- Registration must be approved and completed by the student's high school counselor.
- Payment via NHEC Revtrak is required at the time of registration.
 - o Last Day to Register is May 23rd
 - o Last Day for Refunds is May 28th
- Tuition
 - o New Credit: \$450 for 1 credit and \$225 for 0.5 credit
 - o Credit Recovery: Non-Free and Reduced Lunch students \$175 Free and Reduced Lunch students \$75
- Students that do not attend the first day of summer school will be withdrawn.

Summer Session Dates: June 2, 2025—June 20, 2025

- Students must participate in two onsite sessions per week until the course is completed.
- Students will be able to select preferred days, which will be accommodated when possible.
 - In-Person Learning– Monday/Tuesday 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. @ New Hope OR
 - Wednesday/Thursday 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. @ New Hope
 - Students will work virtually on the days they are not attending in person.
- Students will have access to teachers virtually when not attending on campus.
- More than 1 in-person absence will result in withdrawal.

EOC Testing:

• The weight of the EOC test is 20%. EOC tests will be administered for students enrolled in American Literature, U.S. History, Algebra, and Biology.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. How long does summer school last?

Classes run from June 2nd through June 20th for most classes. EOC classes (Algebra, American Literature, US History, Biology) have Milestones June 24, 25, & 26.

- Can students take new credit? Yes, but on a limited basis. Counselors must communicate with NHEC prior to registration.
- What about NCAA eligibility for student athletes? We can provide NCAA classes during the summer. Students in this situation must complete the entire course as a new credit and cannot end prior to the last
- 4. What about attendance?

Students must attend in-person at New Hope, 2 days a week on Monday/Tuesday <u>OR</u> Wednesday/Thursday. Preferential days of attendance cannot and will not be guaranteed. Transportation is NOT provided by PCSD.

The required time of in-person attendance is 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. Students will work virtually on days that they are not attending in person.

5. How many classes can a student take?

Students may register for either 0.5 or 1.0 credit. Students may only take 1 course. Course fee must be paid via NHEC Revtrak at the time of registration. Refunds will NOT be given due to incomplete coursework.

6. What about End of Course (EOC) testing?

EOC Testing will take place June 24, June 25, and June 26. The weight of the EOC tests is 20%. EOC tests will be administered for students enrolled in American Literature (June 24 & 25), Biology (June 24), Algebra (June 25), and U.S. History (June 26).

- 7. When are the grades sent to the school? Because NHEC is a PCSD program, grades are available to schools once summer school ends and all EOC Milestone scores have been received.
- Are teachers available to help students? Yes. We have certified teachers that are available to reteach and support students with their coursework. All student work is completed on a computer.
- 9. Is there anything else that I need to know?

Summer school is a relatively brief but concentrated school semester so attendance during in-person days is important. Due to the length of summer school, students should expect to spend 4-8 hours per day working on their courses. Student courses are available to them 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We have had great success with our students successfully completing summer school each year. The student controls the pace of the course before the last day of summer school. Teachers are available in-person to help students navigate successfully through summer school.
