



Summer School 2020



Paulding County School District's 2019– 2020 summer school provides an opportunity for all currently enrolled Paulding County School District students in grades 8 – 12 to recover high school level credits attempted throughout the school year. Opportunities for new credit are available on a limited basis. All courses are offered in an online format via PLATO software with our teachers/facilitators.

All grades for summer school will be available to the districted school once the summer school session has ended.

Registration:

- Registration must be approved and completed by the school counselor or NHEC staff.
- Tuition - For this summer session only, tuition has been reduced to reflect the possible economic impact of the Covid-19 closures.
 - Tuition is \$100 per ½ credit and \$200 per full credit to be paid in the form of credit card, debit card, or personal check.
- Payment is required at the time of registration.
- Refunds are provided prior to June 10, 2019.

Site: This summer session is virtual. Students will complete all courses off site. At the time of registration, students will be given further instructions for completing summer school virtually.

Summer Session Information: June 1, 2020—June 26, 2020

EOC Testing: EOC Testing has been waived for this summer session. Students will NOT take end-of-course tests.

Virtual Learning: All summer school students will be virtual learners. All courses will be completed off site. Summer school students will have access to a virtual instructor via Zoom video conferencing.

NCAA Eligibility:

- NHEC summer school meets NCAA requirements for student athletes. Please note that student athletes are not permitted to “test out” of any units and must complete the entire course. It is paramount that student athletes inform their counselors that they require NCAA eligibility.

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FAQ:

1. How long is summer school?
 - 4 weeks from June 1st – June 26th
2. Can students take new credit?
 - Yes, but on a very limited basis. Counselors must communicate with NHEC prior to registration.
3. What about NCAA eligibility for student athletes?
 - We can provide NCAA classes during the summer. Students in this situation must complete the entire course as a new credit and cannot end prior to the last day of summer school.
4. What about virtual status?
 - All students will complete summer school courses at home online via Plato software program. Students will **not** come to a school building to take any summer school courses. Students will have access to a virtual instructor for support via Zoom video conferencing.
5. How many classes can a student take?
 - Students may register for either 0.5 or 1.0 credit. If a student has completed a course by June 12, the student may register for a new class. The additional course registration will occur at NHEC. Payment must be made at the time of registration.
6. What about End of Course (EOC) testing?
 - Testing for EOC courses has been waived for this summer session. Students do not take EOC tests for this summer session.
7. When are the grades sent to the school?
 - Because NHEC is a PCSD program, grades are instantly available to the schools.
8. Are teachers available to help students?
 - Yes. We have certified teachers that are available to reteach and support students with their coursework via Zoom video conferencing. All student work is done on computer.
9. Is there anything else that I need to know?
 - Summer school is a relatively brief but concentrated school semester. Due to the length of summer school students should expect to spend 4-8 hours per day working on their courses. We have had great success with our students successfully completing summer school each year. The student controls the pace of the coursework within the summer school time frame. Teachers are available via Zoom video conferencing to help students navigate successfully through summer school.
