ASSESSMENT OVERVIEW

Food Labs (Formative and/or Summative) – Because of the difficulty in making up a

lab, it is important for students to try to be here on the assigned lab date. If it is necessary to make up a food lab, or if for some other reason why the student cannot participate in the lab, I have alternate assignments that may be done in class (if time permits), or before or after school. If possible sometime the alternative assignments may given for the student to complete at home.

Class Period:

Content Area Projects (Formative and/or Summative) – These consist of subject matter projects, sewing projects, recipe demonstrations, etc. Because these projects are quite time consuming and the students put a great deal of effort into them, <u>these projects usually count at least twice</u>.

Quizzes (Formative) – Students may be quizzed on facts and concepts covered during that week.

Classwork (Formative)– Most classroom assignments are combined by unit and will cover multiple days of instruction. These assignments may be completed in the student's class notebook or as worksheets and may be graded individually or as a unit.

Kitchen Safety & Equipment Exam (Summative)— Students will be tested over principles of kitchen safety and kitchen equipment.
