Please follow the staff's directions for moving forward and remain stopped and in line until all children have safely exited their cars. Cars moving while students are exiting vehicles creates a dangerous situation. Thank you for your support in keeping everyone safe!!

When planning afternoon appointments, please understand that we can't honor phone requests to have students brought to the front office. Students can be called to the office once parents have checked them out. Changes to PM transportation must be made before 12:00pm and students can't be checked out in the office after 2:00pm. Inclement Weather:

Now is a great time to update student information and emergency release plans. If school closes early for inclement weather, students will be dismissed via their normal routine. If your child goes to a daycare or afterschool program, please contact that facility to find out their procedures. In the event of inclement weather, these facilities typically close early and may not pick students up at schools. Having a plan for weather days, is important to child safety.
