## School Board Named Exemplary Board for Fifth Consecutive Year by GSBA

The Paulding County Board of Education is proud to announce it has earned the Georgia School Boards Association's (GSBA) 2024 Exemplary School Board recognition for the fifth consecutive year. Board members will be presented with the honor at GSBA's annual conference Dec. 12-13 at the Renaissance Waverly Hotel in Atlanta.

School boards may apply with GSBA for one of three distinctions: Quality Board, Distinguished Board, or Exemplary Board. The Exemplary Board distinction is the pinnacle of achievement. The PCSD Board of Education first became eligible to apply for Exemplary status in 2020, and that year's award was the first time a PCSD school board had been recognized with GSBA's highest status level.

According to GSBA, the recognition program is designed to showcase best practices in school governance and leadership. GSBA recognizes good school board governance to foster educational community cultures to advance student learning and achievement.
