OVERVIEW

In Paulding County, we expect digital instruction to be delivered with the same standard of high quality experiences that engage and challenge students in the same manner as face-to-face instruction. To that end, instruction should mirror current "instructional musthaves" that our classrooms maintain. But, in addition, there are specific digital practices that must be considered.

DIGITAL PEDAGOGY MUST-HAVES

Use a variety of tools that support strategies including written response, discussion, productivity, collaboration, content delivery, and interaction.

Scaffold and support individualized learner needs even in a digital experience.

Interact in order to nurture learner relationships, encourage learner interaction, and monitor engagement.

Use strategies to ensure learner academic integrity and the security of learner data.

- Find a place to sit at a table or desk where 0 device can stay in one spot

Course overview/syllabus, orientation Reading levels and UDL Keep them inside Canvas as much as possible **Plan in Modules** Learning targets Steps to complete and a checklist of submissions Weekly modules are typical, but a module could be shorter or longer Due dates for everything Plan for multiple modalities Video, Images, Text, External sites such as Virtual Field Trips, Inviting experts, such as Skype a Scientist, and Interactive websites Provide Synchronous and Asynchronous support Web Conferencing Recorded Videos, and Support Documents Provide opportunities for student collaboration and communication Discussion boards using protocols for responding Web conferencing Provide meaningful assessments Multiple opportunities to reach mastery Provide individual written or oral feedback regularly to students Set up clear communication guidelines Office Hours Response time on e-mails Accepted communication methods Communicate regularly with students and parents regarding progression Academic Integrity Utilize DOK 2 and 3 questions Have students justify their answers Multiple versions Limit showing of correct answers Time limits and scheduled exams Students record video, audio answers, or pictures of work
