

What is a Family-School Compact?

A Family-School Compact is an action plan to enhance schools and promote student success.

The Family-School Compact describes how Hal Hutchens Elementary, and families can work together to help children achieve the state's high standards. It outlines how parents, the school staff, and students will share responsibility for improved student academic achievement. Our Compact describes what the school will provide to students and parents, how communication will take place, and how teachers will help students develop necessary skills. It outlines what strategies families can use at home to support their child's learning. These components are linked to our Schoolwide School Improvement and Title I Plans.

How is the Compact Developed?

Third – Fifth Grade Reading Goal: Students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades scoring proficient or distinguished on the Georgia Milestones ELA Assessment will increase from 39.5% (SY24) to 50% (SY25).

Third – Fifth Grade Math Goal: Students scoring above or on grade level with the Math Beacon administration for the 2025 administration will increase from 63% to 70% for third grade; 39% to 42% for fourth grade; and 24% to 43% for fifth grade.

Teachers, Families, and Students – Working Together for Success

Hal Hutchens Teachers:

Teachers will partner with families to work for student success in the following ways:

Reading: Provide reading resources tailored to student's ability level and/or current Lexile range. Provide daily reading with interactive resources and materials. Provide reading tips/strategies on grade level newsletters.

Math: Introduce math practice strategies and activities that can be used at home to support the learning of math.

Parent Resource Center: We will recommend specific skill areas for parents to focus on at home with students and send home reading and math skill building materials from the Parent Resource Center as needed or requested.

Daily Living: Work with social and emotional skills daily. Help students with life skills.

Parent Engagement: Host parent events to showcase reading and math strategies, science standards, student data, and fun ways to learn.

Hal Hutchens Families:

Parents of students at Hal Hutchens Elementary joined staff to develop the following ideas of how families can support student success in reading and math:

Reading: I will encourage my child to read, using leveled books and software as available. Use tips/ strategies provided in the grade level newsletter.

Math: I will encourage my child to practice math using the strategies and activities introduced at school to reinforce what is being taught in the classroom.

Parent Resource Center: I will request and borrow suggested items from the Parent Resource Center and use these items to build reading and math skills at home.

Communication: Contact teachers with needs to support at home learning and just keep in touch with any needs or requests.

Parent Engagement: I will make plans to attend at least two parent events (parent conferences, family nights, parent meetings). Events may be virtual or face-to-face.

Hal Hutchens Students:

Hal Hutchens Elementary students joined staff and parents in developing plans to be the best we can be in reading and math.

Reading: I will spend time nightly reading material that is on my reading level. I will read to or with my parent/guardian every day to meet my fluency goals and increase my vocabulary. I will set reading goals and monitor my progress towards meeting them. Use reading strategies my teacher introduces to me.

Math: I will explain math strategies and activities to my parent/guardian when completing math practice. I will practice math facts using the strategies and activities used in class. I will set math goals and monitor my progress towards meeting them.

Parent Resource Center: I will take home and use reading and math items from the Parent Resource Center as needed to use with my parent or guardian.

Parent Engagement: I will encourage my parent/guardian/family to attend at least two parent events this school year.

Compacts are discussed with parent(s)/guardians and students during Parent/Teacher Conferences (10/7/24 and 10/8/24). Feedback, and requests for support, are welcome at any time. The parent(s)/guardians of each student at Hal Hutchens Elementary receives a Compact during Open House, and teachers share details of the student role as stated in the Compact with all students.
