Readina

We will begin reading <u>Lulu and the Brontosaurus</u>. This is a wonderful book about a little girl, named Lulu. She is used to getting whatever she wants...however, her request for a brontosaurus on her birthday is not a very feasible request. Lulu begins a 4-day temper tantrum and storms off into the forest to find her very own pet brontosaurus. There is a great twist in the story and the students really enjoy hearing about Lulu and Mr. B! Students will be writing in their journal about what the main idea of each chapter is.

We will continue to work on retelling the story as well as book elements; such as, setting, character, and events.

Math

We will be reviewing some of the measurement standards from the previous nine weeks. This includes ordering objects from either largest to smallest or smallest to largest. We will also be reviewing time and interpreting data. Some of these standards will be extended on. For example, when ordering objects, students will be doing some writing to explain how to order objects. For time, students may be working on elapsed time (telling how much time has passed or needs to pass).

Depending upon how our class does, we may begin working with comparing numbers and using the greater than (>), less than (<) and equal to (=) symbols. Prior to this, students were comparing numbers without using the symbols.

MD1: Orders and compares length MD2: Measures length MD3: Tells time (to the hour) MD4: Represents and interprets data.

School - to -Home Connection

Reading: As you are reading discuss verbs. Does your child notice that an -ed makes the verb past tense? You can also discuss present and future tense. Use and review these terms with your child.

<u>Math:</u> Play war with your child. Instead of using just one card per player, create double digit numbers. Players flip two cards instead of one. Determine what the face cards will value prior to playing. Use the terms: greater than, less than, and equal to.

<u>Phonics:</u> While reading, be on the lookout for compound words. Have your child keep a list of them. Review the words or have your child use them in sentences.

Language Arts

For phonics, we will be reviewing skill such as compound words, contractions, and root words with prefixes and suffixes. There will be NO spelling assessment this week.

We will begin writing opinion pieces, our students will need to state an opinion, give a reason, explain the reason, and then restate the opinion (OREO strategy). We will also begin studying verbs (past, present, and future) and how/why they are different.
