### Parent Resource Center

Nebo Elementary’s **vision** is to work with our learning community members and our local community members to ensure our students are engaged in a quality educational experience that is provided in a safe, productive environment as they prepare to become contributing lifelong learners in our local and global community.

Nebo Elementary’s **mission** is to engage in learning.

## Nebo Elementary Goals

- Students in grades K-2 will increase at or above benchmark levels from 53% to 65% as measured by the Acadience composite scores from August 2022 to May 2023.
- Students in grades 3-5 will increase proficiency in Math from 45 % to 60 % as measured by the Math Georgia Milestones from May 2022 to May 2023.
- Students in grades 3-5 will increase proficiency in ELA from 29 % to 50 % as measured by the ELA Georgia Milestones from May 2022 to May 2023.
- We will increase student engagement in grades K-5 to reduce major behavior referrals impacting student achievement by having less than 10% of our student population with two or more major behavior referrals as measured in Infinite Campus from August 2022 to May 2023.

## Paulding County School District Goals

- By May 2023, increase the percentage of professional learning incentives that positively impact student achievement by 30%, as indicated through the District PL Survey and participation report(s).
  - Equity Gap: Inexperienced teachers (less than four years of experience)
- By May of 2023, increase collaboration opportunities to engage District staff, families, and communities by 20% as indicated through the Federal Program's Outcome Goals and participation report(s).
  - Equity Gap: N/A
- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 3% annually as measured by achievement data.
  - Equity Gap: School Mean Growth Percentile (SGP)

## Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

### *In the Pre-K Classroom*

The Kindergarten team will work with students and their families in partnership for student success in Reading and Math. We will work with families to support students in the following ways:

- ✓ Expose students to various math concept such as numbers, counting, shapes, and patterns.
- ✓ Expose students to the letters in the alphabet, letter sounds, and different genres of literature, such as, fiction, nonfiction, and nursery rhymes.
- ✓ Encourage parents to check out resources using from the Parent Resource Room and to attend bi-monthly parent meetings and family learning nights.
- ✓ Communicate weekly via emails, Remind 101, Seesaw, and Class Dojo messages to keep parents informed about homework, assessments, and upcoming school events.

### *At home*

Nebo School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in Reading and Math:

- ✓ Practice the various math concepts through everyday activities.
- ✓ Read with my child every night for at least 10 minutes.
- ✓ Utilize the Parent Resource center in our front lobby to check out games and other resources to support my child's learning at home.
- ✓ Check weekly teacher communication to ensure my child is on target and make plans to attend at least two upcoming school events.

### *Nebo Elementary Students*

Nebo students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and help row in the right direction towards success in Reading and Math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ✓ Practice counting objects, naming numbers, and naming shapes.
- ✓ Sit with a family member every night to read.
- ✓ Encourage my parents to check out games and materials from the Parent Resource Center in my school's front lobby.
- ✓ Talk to my family about the things I'm learning and encourage them to attend at least two school events.
