4th Grade Tiny House Challenge

Contest Rules:

Just a few rules to keep in mind when designing and building your Tiny House:

- 1. Tiny home models must be three-dimensional, fit on a base no larger than 2 feet by 2 feet and be no taller than 2 feet. Entries larger than these dimensions will NOT be accepted!
- 2. Tiny Homes can be built of any materials you would like to use, including, but not limited to:
 - ♦ Wood
 - Cardboard
 - Plastic
 - ♦ Rock
- 3. Submissions must include and labeled:
 - Drawing of what you built (Tiny House Design Plan submitted through Canvas)
 - List of materials used (Tiny House Material List submitted through Canvas)
 - Tiny home model you have created
- 4. Tiny homes will be judged on the following criteria (rubric available on PCSD Work-Based Learning website at https://www.paulding.k12.ga.us/Page/46715
 - Overall appearance and design
 - Originality/Creativity
 - Workmanship/Technique
 - Level of Difficulty
 - Drawing, material list, other documentation and video presentation no more than 3 minutes including below bullets must be submitted through Canvas:
 - * Guided tour of your Tiny House
 - Explanation of how Tiny House was built
 - Interesting features of Tiny House
 - * Anything else you would like to share about your Tiny House
